

Frosty Strawberry Squares Recipe of the Month from your Editor

1 Cup Sifted Flour2 Egg Whites1/4 Cup Brown Sugar1 Cup Sugar


1/2 Cup Finely Chopped Nuts 2 Cups Sliced Strawberries*
1/2 Cup Oleo, Melted 2 tablespoons Lemon Juice

1 Cup Whipping Cream, Whipped

Stir first four ingredients together. Spread evenly in a shallow pan (like a cookie sheet). Bake in 350°F oven for 20 minutes stirring occasionally. Sprinkle 2/3 of the crumb mixture in a 13 x 9 x 2 pan. Combine egg whites, sugar, lemon juice and berries. Beat with high speed to stiff peaks, about 10 minutes. (I didn't think it was possible to get this to stiff peaks, but it does beat up like

plain egg whites.) Fold in whipped cream. Spoon over crumbs and top with remaining crumbs. Freeze 6 hours or overnight. Serves 12. Keeps indefinitely (in the freezer, of course).

*Instead of fresh berries, use a 10 ounce package of frozen berries partially thawed and reduce sugar to 2/3 cup.

I think when you own one of these pieces of history like a Model A it gets in your blood. Since we have owned "Lady" our Model A, we have won several first place trophies and honorable mentions. She is shown in the Classic Auto Parts Catalog 1928-1931, page 27, upper right hand corner. The burgundy body and black fenders and top. She has debuted in the movie "Wisteria" coming out this summer to a theater near you.

I think our goal someday is to trade our coupe off for a sedan so we can share rides with our kids and hopefully someday our grand-kids in parades. Who knows maybe someday they might get the Model A bug, and the saga will continue.

It has not hurt that Beth has become friends with Ken Begley and has his shop number on speed dial. It makes Birthdays and Christmas time a whole lot more fun, opening up presents.

We sold the 1931 Model A to the same brother who helped me purchase my very first Model A. Of course, since this hobby runs in the family, he got a real deal on this car! We kept the 1930 Model A Deluxe Coupe (now named Baby) and begin restoring it. Thanks to Bob Bordwine's advice we got our upholstery kit from a guy who makes them in a little shack, in Hot Springs, AR, while we were on vacation there. Doing this project was a great time of frustration and joy for Beth and I as we worked on this project. The car is 99% complete, and we can say restoration might not be for everybody, but for us it was a great learning experience, if you have a strong marriage, time, patience, and enough money!

We are ready to move on to a new project, so the old car has got to go. So Baby, the 1930 Deluxe Coupe is for sale.
