



THEME "COUNT ME IN! I PLEDGE TO BE DRUG FREE."


PLEASE TO NOT THROW CANDY FROM CARS, USE WALKERS.

### My Model A Story

It all started when I was about 10 or 12 years old. My dentist had a '26 or '27 Model T roadster. One day he piled about three of us kids in the front seat with him to go for a ride. That ride was cut short when a friend of his pointed out that the right front tire had a hole about 1½" in diameter in the tread. The inner tube was bulging out. With the help of a little masking tape wrapped through the spokes and around the tire tread, we were headed home. My ride had just been cut short. It was right then that I decided this would not happen again; I would have my "very own Model T" someday.

When I was sixteen, I had a Vespa motor scooter that propelled me around all the back roads at 47 mph top speed, and I knew every Model T and Model A in and behind every barn in Barton County Missouri. By that time, the Model A was the preferred antique car. So ultimately my "very own Model T" came in the form of a late 1928 Model A Special Coupe. \$85 of my own money, \$15 borrowed from Dad, and I drove it home. Then came new wood fabricated in high school wood shop, shiny 1959 Corvette Roman red enamel paint sprayed in a gravel floored garage,



16" wire wheels with slick S-3 synthetic rubber WWII tires from a scrap pile and white port-a-walls, a \$15 vinyl interior and lots of pride, and my first car was on the road. That lasted until my Dad insisted that I needed a 'real' car for college. So I traded for a '35 Ford five window coupe.

Fast forward about seven years.....I moved to Oklahoma City. Through the years and with the help of Rod and Custom magazines (remember the little 5½ X 8½ format?) I had developed a desire for a Model A roadster pickup. In '69, I thought I had died and gone to Heaven when a '29 roadster pickup showed up in the classified ads right here in OKC. When I first saw it, it was a beauty. Missing the driver's door, no top irons, rusty and bent sheet metal, but it was a roadster pickup. Now with my rare find, I joined Sooner Model A Ford Club which met at Dub Richardson Ford on North May. What a surprise when I found that my rare pickup had twelve identical twins already in the club.

After an amateur restoration, Tommy Hudson (the trailer guy in Ada) decided he wanted my pickup more than I did, and I needed his unrestored '29 phaeton more than he did. Even trade. Now I had to start all over with the restoration process on the phaeton. A year later and I was on my way to my first Regional Meet in Vale, CO. What an experience; driving a Model A in the mountains.



Shortly after that trip, I asked my across the street neighbor if she wanted to go for a Model A ride. A trip across town, a loose wheel and a stop in the park, and the rest is history. 32 years later Carla and I still enjoy that Model A phaeton (our courting car), the Sooner Model A Ford Club and the yearly Regional Meets.

We also have a 1930 Briggs Town Sedan (owned for over 30 years), but that's another story in its own right.

### TIP OF THE MONTH

Do you have a problem with Engine coolant foaming in the radiator? Does you water pump leak when you stop the engine? Possibly the two events are connected.

Under the right conditions (usually at higher speeds), it is possible for the water pump to suck air in at the leaking shaft seal. This in turn gets churned into the water and foam is created.

This can be checked by squirting a little water on the pump shaft right in front of the bushing. If it gets sucked in, there's your problem. If not, look elsewhere.

While this is not the only cause for foamy coolant, it is certainly one to check. Another obvious cause is a blown or leaking head gasket. A leaking head gasket can be verified with a combustion leak detector available at many mechanic shops or at your friendly NAPA dealer for about \$50.
