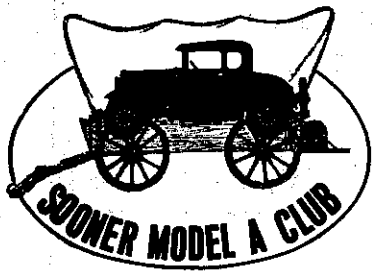
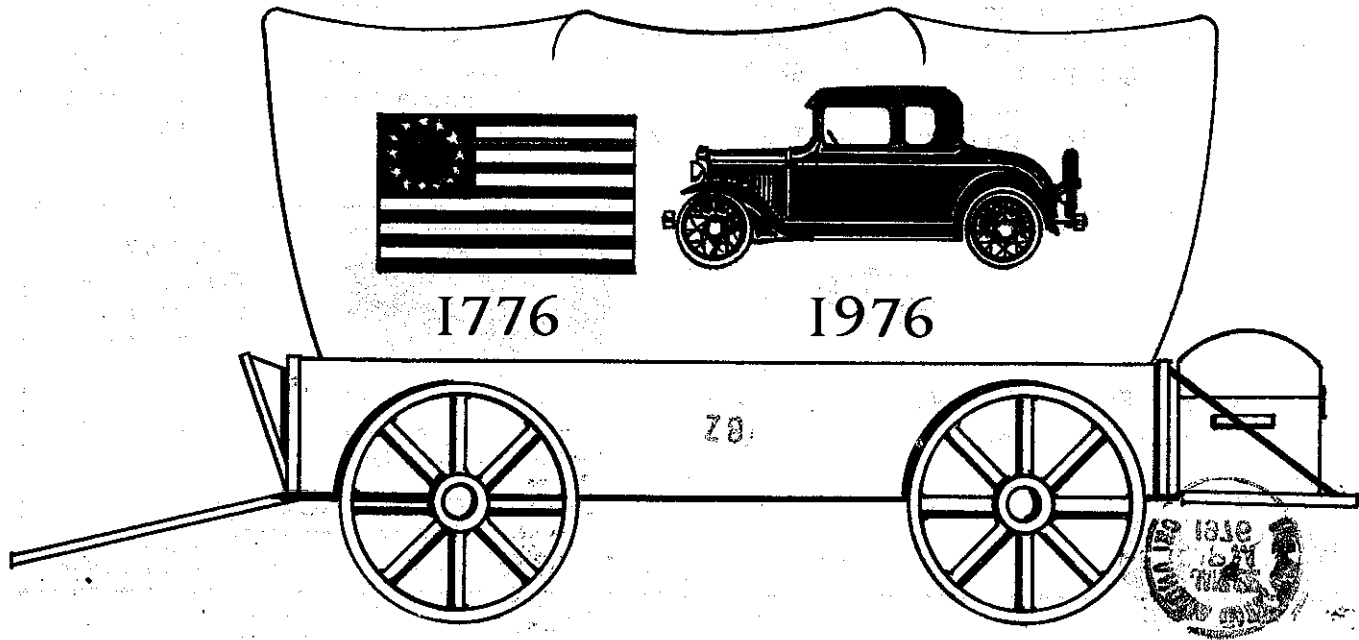

Send me names and addresses of any person you know who has a Model A who is not a member of the club. We will send them as few issues of the newsletter and try to get them to attend the club meetings and outings.



This event was really enjoyable. Everyone who participated really had a great time and we all voted to request a rematch - that Hare is going to get caught by all the Hounds next time.

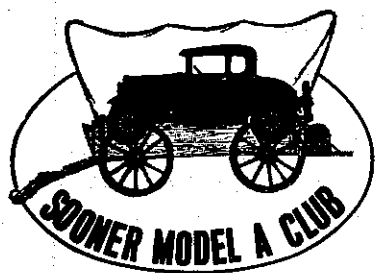
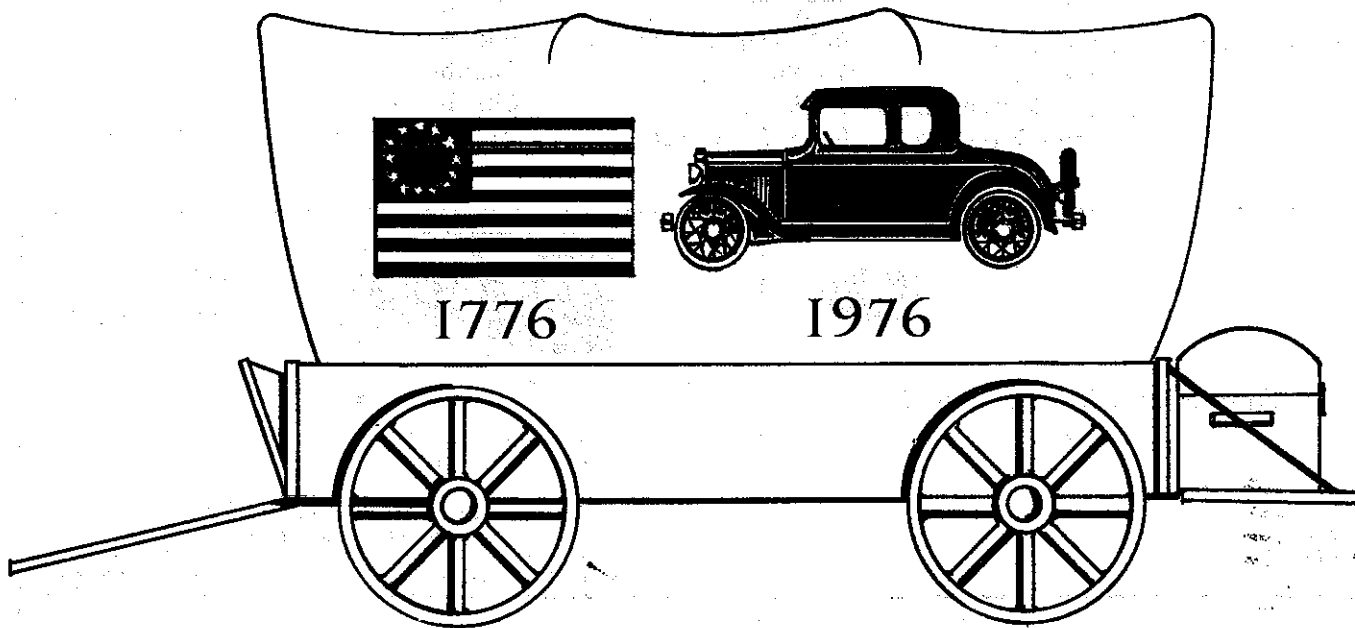

### PUMPKIN CAKE ROLL

BY Cherrylnn Goodman

#### Cake:

3 eggs  
1 c sugar  
2/3 c cooked pumpkin  
1 tsp lemon juice  
3/4 c flour  
1 tsp baking powder  
2 tsps cinnamon  
1/2 tsp salt  
1/2 c chopped nuts  
Shortening  
Powdered sugar

#### Filling:

1 c powdered sugar  
2 3-oz pkg cream cheese  
4 tblsp butter or margarine  
1/2 tsp vanilla

Beat 3 eggs on high speed for 5 minutes. Gradually beat in 1 cup sugar. Stir in 2/3 cup cooked pumpkin and 1 teaspoon lemon juice. Stir together: 3/4 cup flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 2 teaspoons cinnamon and 1/2 teaspoon salt. Fold into pumpkin mixture. Spread in greased and floured pan, 15" x 10" x 1". (It's very important to grease pan with shortening instead of oil.) Top with 1/2 cup finely chopped nuts. Bake at 375° for 15 minutes. Turn out on towel sprinkled with powdered sugar. Starting at narrow end, roll towel and cake together. Cool. Unroll for filling.

Filling: Combine 1 cup powdered sugar, 2 3-oz. pkg. cream cheese, 4 tablespoons butter or margarine and 1/2 teaspoon vanilla. Beat until smooth. Spread over cake. Roll, chill, 8 servings.

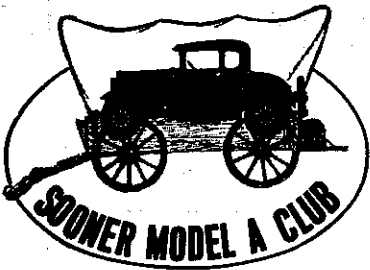
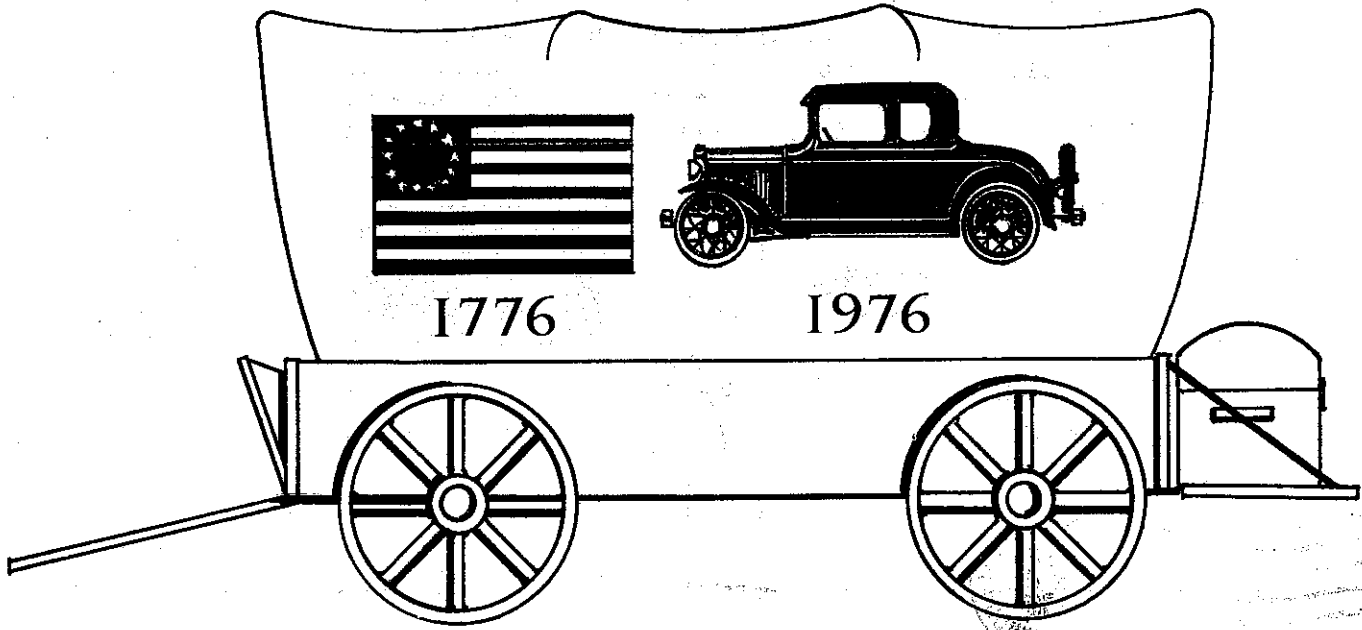

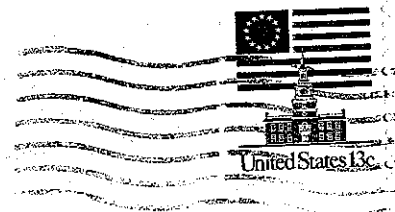

I have been very encouraged this year that we have spent more time displaying the cars at shopping centers and driving in parades.

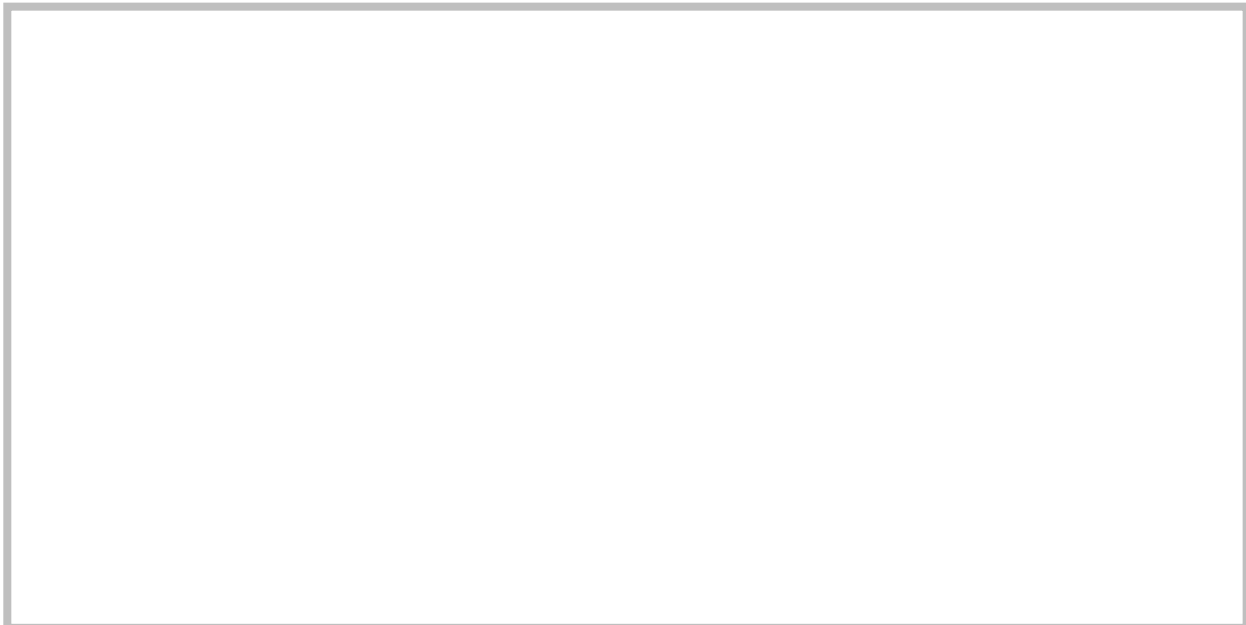

## RECOMMENDED CHANGES TO THE BY-LAWS

The Board of Directors voted at the last board meeting to recommend the following changes to the By-Laws.

This page and the following one describe each change that is recommended. The last four pages are a copy of the by-laws as they would read if the recommended changes are approved.

Please read the changes carefully. Any questions you have concerning the changes will be discussed at the September Club Meeting. The vote on accepting or rejecting the changes will be taken at the October Club Meeting.

### Article III

Section 2. Wording changed to clarify that each the husband and the wife have a vote in elections, etc.

Section 3. The phrase "family membership: was deleted to clarify the section which states that a child in a family can join the Sooner Model A Club without an individual membership in the national club.

Section 4. The last sentence was changed to say that membership ceases if dues are not paid by March 31.

## Article IV

Section 4. Deleted. The election of officers is discussed in Article V and need not be mentioned here.

## Article V

Section 1. The parenthetic statement that the officers are hereafter called the Executive Council was deleted. The Executive Council is described in Article VI.

Section 2. The sentence "The Executive Council will each have one vote at the executive meeting" was moved to Article VI, section 2. The section was changed to say that an officer must be able to attend most (not all) of the meetings.

Section 3. Simplified wording. No change in meaning.

Section 4. Added that the nominating committee must let the members know 10 days ahead of the September meeting who the nominees will be. This gives the membership time to consider the selection before they have to vote. Other wording is simplified with no change in meaning.

Section 5. The procedure for absentee voting at the October meeting is detailed in case more than one person is nominated for one office. Other wording is simplified with no change in meaning.

## Article VI

Section 2. Added "Each officer shall have one vote at the Executive Council meetings (moved from Article V).

Section 3 & 5. Requires 48 hours advance notice of special Executive Council meetings or change of regular Executive Council meetings.

Article VII - adds a membership committee to the list of required committees. It combines the activities and tour committees into one committee.

Article IX - Adds the requirements that:

1. Changes to the by-laws must be discussed at one regular club meeting and voted at the next regular club meeting.
2. That all members must receive copies of the changes prior to the meeting when they will be discussed.
3. That all changes to the by-laws are effective immediately upon being ratified by a majority of the members voting.
4. An open vote is sufficient unless a vote by ballot is requested.
5. The procedure for absentee voting is detailed.

Article XI is deleted. It specified that each car owned by a family could be driven in car games two times. Details such as these should be written policies of the board and not part of the by-laws.



## BY-LAWS

### ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Sooner Model A Club. It shall be a chapter of the Model A Ford Club of America with its principal office in the Greater Oklahoma City Area.

### ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

Section 1. This organization will strive to unite in a central organization all owners of Model A Ford cars who are interested in restoring and maintaining the car in a manner to attract prestige and respect within the community.

Section 2. This organization will serve as a medium for the exchange of ideas, information, and parts for admirers of the Model A Ford car, and an aid in efforts to restore and preserve the car in its original likeness.

Section 3. This organization will help owners become better acquainted with one another and encourage and maintain among its members the spirit of good fellowship, sociability and fair play through sponsored activities including the use of the Model A Ford and family participation.

Section 4. This organization will be non-profit, non-commercial, non-sectarian, and non-partisan.

### ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The primary requirement for membership shall be an interest in the objectives of the organization and a desire to participate in its activities. Actual possession of a Model A Ford is not a necessity. A member must be of good character as to be of benefit to the club, its functions and activities. An active member must be a member of the Model A Ford Club of America.

Section 2. An active membership shall entitle each the husband and the wife or a single person the following privileges: a) one vote for each in club elections, ammendments to the by-laws, etc., b) participation for each in club competition for prizes, etc., c) notice of club activities, d) a copy of the by-laws, e) a copy of the membership roster, f) a copy of the club publication, and g) a membership card. Items c through g will be shared jointly by husband and wife.

Section 3. A dependent of an active member may become an active member of the Sooner Model A Club without having an individual membership of the Model A Ford Club of America. A dependent shall be defined as a person eligible to be claimed as an exemption for federal income tax.

Section 4. Membership dues to the Sooner Model A Club shall be five dollars (\$5.00) per year. Active members are encouraged to pay their membership dues to the Model A Ford Club of America through the local club. Membership in the club is based on the calendar year. Members are encouraged to pay their dues prior to the beginning of the year. Dues will be considered delinquent and continuous membership will cease if dues are not paid by March 31.

Section 5. Dues paid on or after October 1 are valid for the remainder of the year in which paid and the following year. In this case, the member may elect to wait until the beginning of the year to join the Model A Club of America.

Section 6. Any member may resign by filing a written resignation with the secretary. Such resignation shall not relieve the member resigning of the obligation to pay any dues, assessments or other charges theretofore accrued and unpaid.

Section 7. Membership in this organization is not transferable.

#### ARTICLE IV - MEETING OF MEMBERS

Section 1. The regular monthly meeting of the club members shall be held at 7:30 p.m. on the fourth Tuesday of each month. The time of any particular meeting may be varied by the Executive Council. Members must be given prior written notice of such a change.

Section 2. Special meetings of the members may be called either by the President a quorum of the Executive Council or not less than one-tenth of the members having voting rights. A written notice stating the place, day and time of any special meeting must be delivered to each member not less than five nor more than forty days before the date of such meeting. The purpose for which the special meeting is called shall be stated in the notice.

Section 3. The Executive Council shall select the place of meeting for all club meetings.

#### ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of the club shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Editor, and six (6) Directors.

Section 2. An officer must be a member of the Sooner Model A Club. An officer must be able to attend most of the monthly meetings of the members and the Executive Council. The treasurer must be able to be bonded.

Section 3. The term of office shall be for a period of one (1) year except that the six (6) Directors shall serve a term of two (2) years. Three (3) Directors shall be elected each year. An officer shall not succeed himself or herself in the same office. The term of office shall begin on January 1.

Section 4. A nominating committee shall be appointed by the President by August 5 of each year. The committee shall consist of not less than three (3) active club members. The committee shall nominate members who in their opinion will be best qualified to serve as officers of the club.

At least ten (10) days prior to the September club meeting the nominating committee shall cause all members to be notified of the candidates it will place in nomination.

At the regular September club meeting the nominating committee shall place in nomination its candidates for the offices to be filled. The President shall open the meeting for nominations from the floor. No club member may be nominated by the nominating committee or from the floor unless said club member shall have been contacted in regard to such nomination and shall have agreed to serve if elected.

Section 5. In the event that only one person is nominated for an office, that person will be elected by acclamation of the membership at the September club meeting.

If more than one person is nominated for an office, the nominating committee shall cause a ballot for each office so contended to be prepared for voting at the October club meeting. Members unable to attend the October club meeting may send their vote to the nominating committee prior to the October club meeting. Members voting by mail must identify themselves on the outside of the envelope. The ballots will be removed from the envelope at the October club meeting in such a fashion that no individual will know how another member voted if possible.

Section 6. The president shall be the principal executive officer of the club and shall in general supervise all of the business and affairs of the club. He or she shall preside at all meetings of the members and the Executive Council. He or she shall perform all duties incident to the office of President.

Section 7. In the absence of the President, the Vice President shall perform the duties of the President.

Section 8. The Secretary shall keep minutes of the meetings of the members and the Executive Council. He or she shall see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws, keep a register of the post office address of each member, and in general perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary.

Section 9. The Treasurer shall have custody and responsibility for all funds of the club. All books and records of the club may be inspected by any member or his agent or attorney for any purpose at any reasonable time. Two members of the outgoing Executive Council appointed by the President and the newly elected Treasurer will review the status of the books at the end of the term of the Treasurer.

Section 10. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Council will be filled by appointment by the Executive Council for the unexpired portion of the term.

Section 11. All officers are subject to recall. Charges shall be presented in writing to the Executive Council. Charges shall be signed by thirty (30) percent of the Executive Council or by twenty-five (25) percent of the membership. The recalled officer (s) shall have the opportunity of defense at all meetings when the charges are discussed. If sixty-six (66) percent of the Executive Council present approves the recall, it shall be presented to the next meeting of the members. If seventy-five (75) percent of the members present approve the recall, the officer(s) shall be recalled.

Section 12. No member shall receive compensation for services rendered to the club.

#### ARTICLE VI - EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

Section 1. The Executive Council shall be composed of the eleven (11) elected officers of the club.

Section 2. The Executive Council shall manage the business and affairs of the club. Each officer shall have one vote at the Executive Council meetings.

Section 3. The regular monthly meetings of the Executive Council shall be at 7:30 p.m. on the first (1st) Tuesday of each month. The time of any particular meeting may be varied by the President. Executive Council members must be given

at least 48 hour prior notice of such a change.

Section 4. The place of the regular monthly Executive Council meeting shall be determined by the Executive Council or the President.

Section 5. Special meetings of the Executive Council may be called by the President or not less than three (3) members of the Executive Council. Executive Council members must be given at least 48 hours prior notice of a special meeting stating time, place, and purpose.

Section 6. The presence of six (6) members of the Executive Council shall constitute a quorum. If less than six (6) members of the Executive Council are present, a meeting cannot be convened.

#### ARTICLE VII - COMMITTEES

A program committee, a membership committee and an activity/tour committee shall be appointed by the President. Other committees may be appointed as necessary. It is recommended that one member (preferably the chairman) of each committee be a member of the Executive Council. The President shall serve as an ex-officio member of each committee.

#### ARTICLE VIII - ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Alcoholic beverages shall not be consumed during the regular monthly meeting of the club.

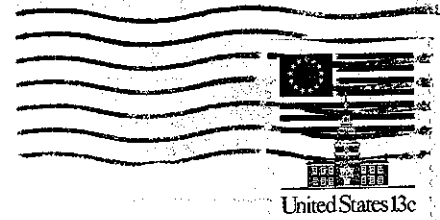
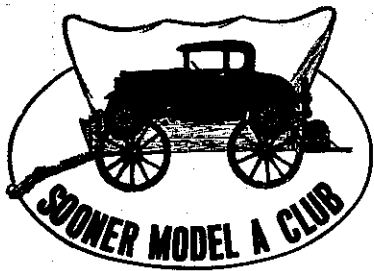
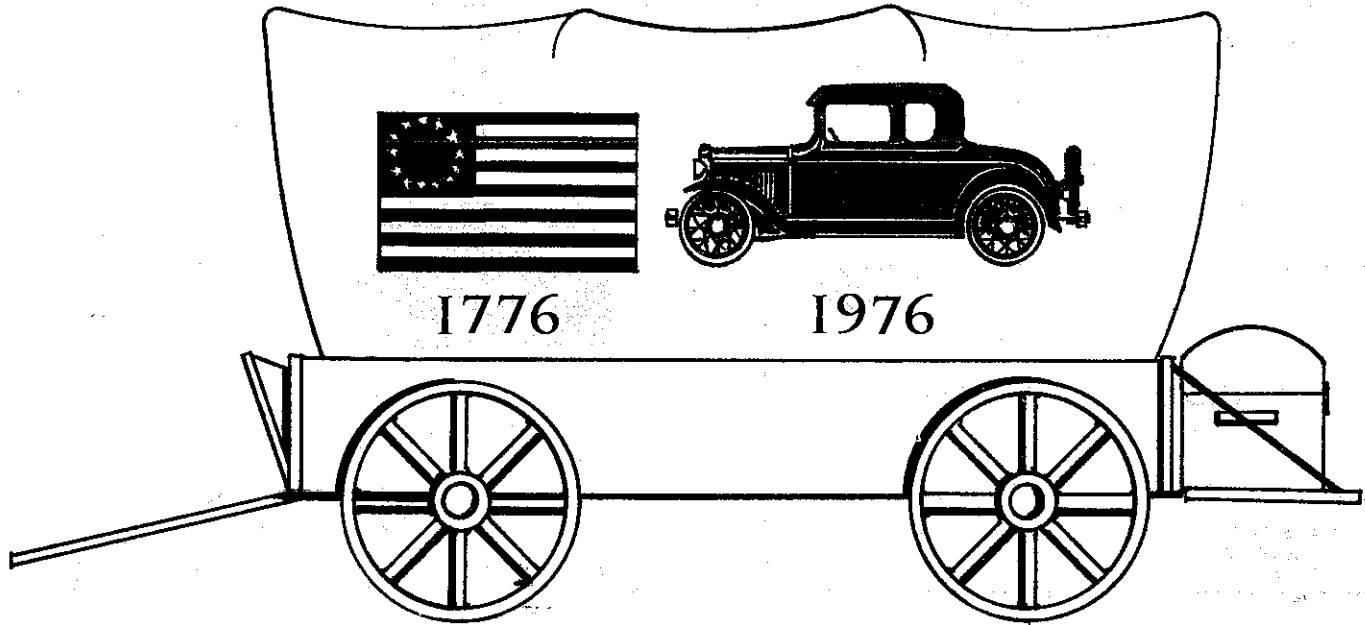
#### ARTICLE IX - AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS

A proposed amendment to the by-laws must be approved by the Executive Council for submission to the membership. The proposed amendment shall be provided to the membership within sixty (60) days. The members will vote on the amendment at the second regular club meeting after it is received. Questions concerning the amendments will be called for and discussed at the first regular club meeting after it is received. There will be an open vote unless a vote by ballot is requested. If the proposed amendment receives a majority vote of the members voting, it will be incorporated immediately in the by-laws of the club. Members unable to attend the meeting at which a vote on the by-laws will be conducted, may send their vote to the Executive Council prior to the meeting. Members so voting must identify themselves on the outside of the envelope. The ballot will be removed from the envelope at the meeting in such a fashion that no individual will know how another member voted if possible.

#### ARTICLE X-- TRUSTEES

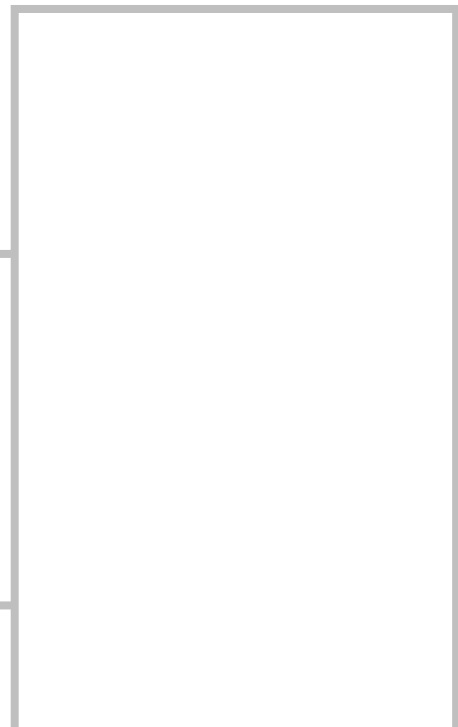
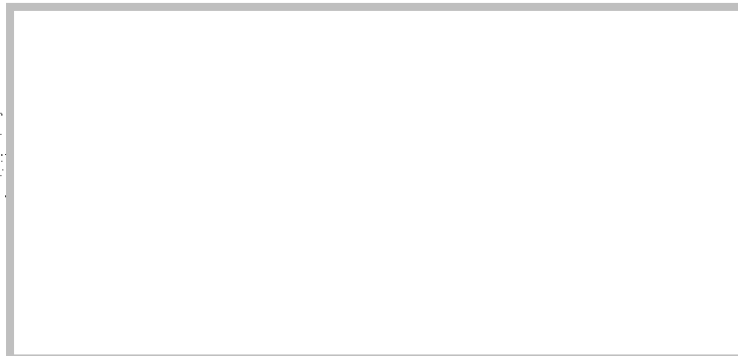

How do we find these people and include them in the activities and goals of the club? Are we doing what we should be doing if we are not reaching these people or can not reach them? What should we be doing?

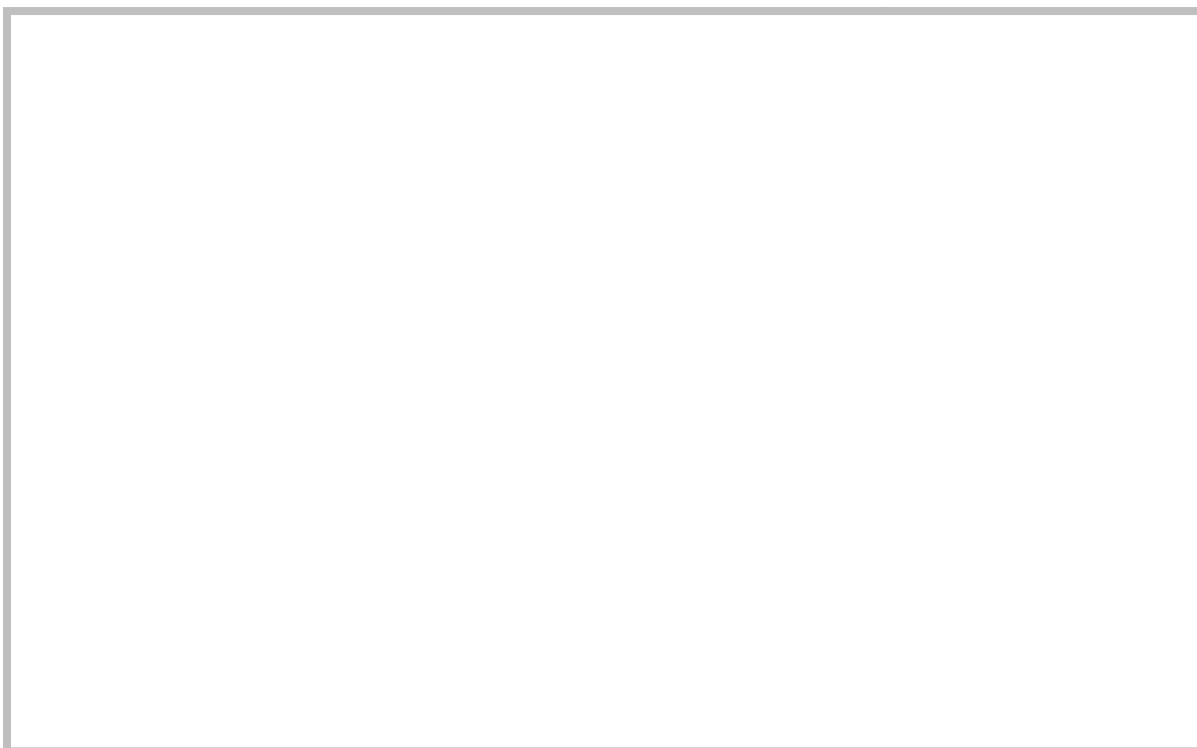
